Inside may be used while describing *position/location* as opposed to outside. (*The box is blue colored inside and black outside.*)

Within may be used for *time/space*. (*I'll reach there within ten minutes. Stay within the boundaries.*)

Intra- is a prefix which means *within or inside one group*. For example, while the *internet* is a system that connects computers around the world, an *intranet*, is a network of computers that only connects people within a certain group, such as employees at a company. An *intrastate highway* system only connects the various cities within one state.

There are many medical terms that start with *intra*. For example, *intravenous*, means through, in, or into a vein, not between different veins. Similarly, *intramuscular* means within one muscle.
